1. Call to Order, welcome, and introductions

2. Approval of the minutes of April 18, 2023

3. New LSP process and planning for Technical Services needs assessment, RFP processes and migration

1. Current status overview and discussion/questions

- a. <u>Update</u>
- **b.** NEOS libraries will need to migrate to a new Library System Platform (LSP), ideally seeking group solutions. NEOS will no longer be a completely shared catalogue.

NEOS directors still committed to resource sharing even without joint LSP. Members sign two agreements: one with U of A to provide joint Integrated Library System (ILS), which will end, and another to share resources and carry out consortial activity, which will now have to take place in a modified form going forward.

c. Broad timeline overview

U of A looking at Request for Proposal (RFP)/vendor selection/migration throughout 2024 with projected end date 2025. MacEwan will be advanced test case as they are already engaged in RFP process. Other members will have to navigate other solutions to be determined.

d. LSP landscape considerations

Given finite number of vendors, likely scenario involves groups of NEOS members adopting similar platforms if possible.

2. Groups working on LSP migration

In general, more frequent shorter meetings recommended as many details either unknown, in flux, or subject to frequent dynamic change(s) at this time.

- a. By institution: UAL LSP Working Group, MacEwan, ...
- b. NEOS Service Model Task force to support libraries in determining their solutions
- c. NEOS Access Committee meeting monthly to discuss implications, alternatives, etc. Determine what to do with user accounts (active/expired), outstanding items/charges, etc.
- d. NEOS Technical Services Committee

Considering adopting similar monthly schedule with agenda to adapt as required.

3. Role of NEOS-Tech and next steps

a. Needs assessment.

Elaine has prepared an edited version of the UAL high level system requirements to inform individual potential RFP proposals.

MacEwan will possibly share competitive bid memo which contains requirements for their RFP for comparison.
